A champion approach to digital inclusion

11m adults in the UK don't have the digital skills they need to make the most of our online world, whether that's applying for jobs, keeping in touch or managing their money.¹

We work in partnership to help people learn essential digital skills through recruiting and training Digital Champions. These are trusted people in local places who can pass on digital skills in an informal way.

We received a three year grant from the Big Lottery in June 2017. Here's how we're using it to help more people.

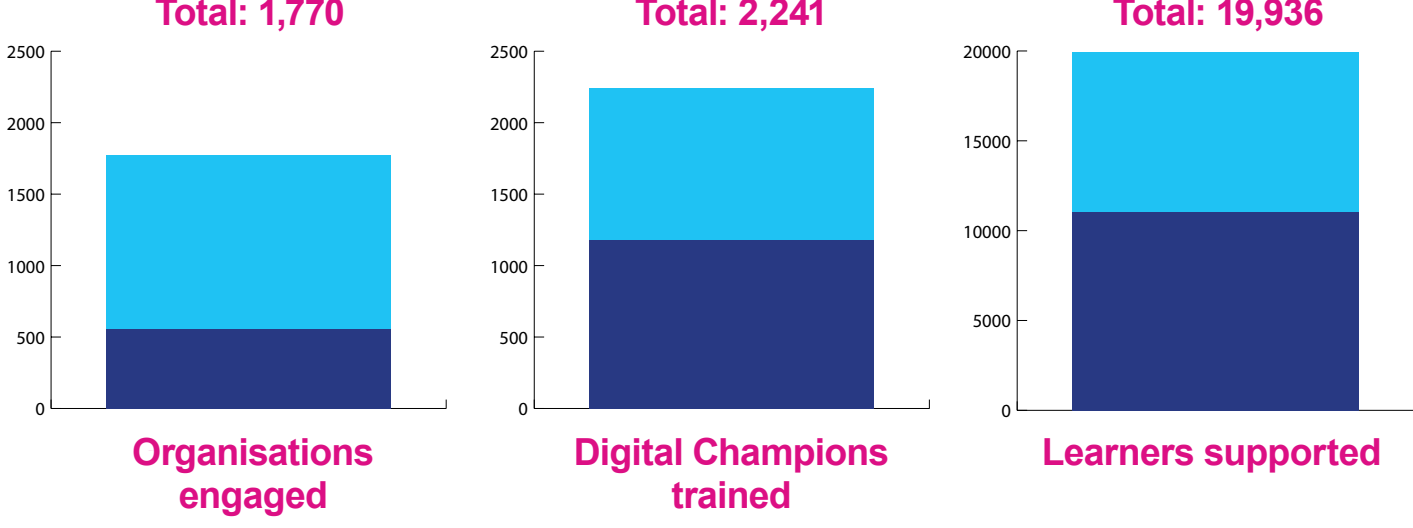

WE'RE REACHING MORE PEOPLE

Since we started in 2015 we have trained over 2,200 Digital Champions and supported almost 20,000 people to learn new skills:

WE COLLABORATE

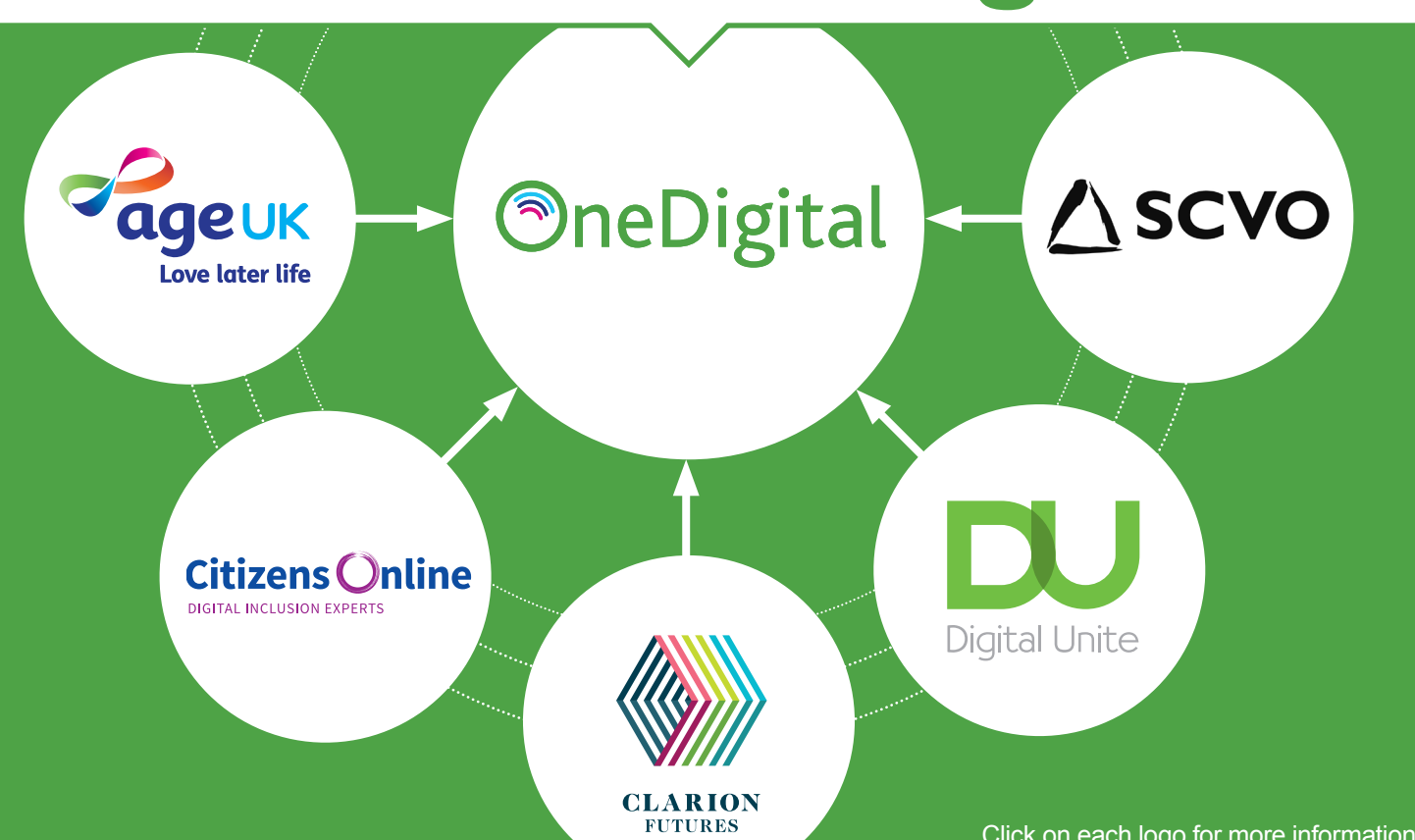
We have spent this year making links with the organisations, decision-makers and groups who also want to help more people and organisations gain better digital skills
